This Indenture

Made the Twenty first day of July, in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Thirty four Between Samuel Quigley, his wife Of the Town of Napoleon Jackson County Mo. I. & C. On

the first part, and Ira Woodworth of the same place of the second part, Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty Dollars to him in hand paid by the said parties of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged have granted, bar gained, sold, remised, released, aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, remise release alien and Confirm unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns forever, all that place or piece of Land situated in the Town of Napoleon Mo. I. Bounded and described as follows viz: Beginning on the Town line Sixty rods East of the North west corner of Township Four, South of Range Two East. Thence South four Degrees West Sixty five rods and nine links, thence South Eighty Six degrees East twelve rods and seventeen links. Thence North Four degrees East Twenty five rods and nine links. Thence North Eighty Six degrees West twenty rods and seventeen links to the place of Beginning, containing two acres of Land be the same more or less. Together with all and singulars the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainders and remainders, rents issues and profits thereon, and all the estate, right, title interest, claim or demand whatsoever of the said parties of the first part, either in law or equity, of in and to the above bargained premises with the said hereditaments and appurtenances. To have and to hold the said premises as above described, unto the aforesaid parties unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns forever. And the said parties of the first part, for themselves, heirs, executors and administrators doth Concur, grant, bargain and agree, to and with the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, that at the time of the sealing and delivery of these presents we are well seized of the premises above Conveyed as of a good sure perfect, absolute and indefeasible Estate of inheritance in the Land in fee simple; And that the above bargained premises in the quiet and peaceable possession of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns against all and every person or persons lawfully claiming to to

claim the whole or any part thereof we will forever warrant and defend.
