256 **LUCY MARIA⁶ WARNER**, daughter of John⁵ Warner, lived in Litchfield, and Cedarville, Herkimer County, N. Y., where she died, aged over 60. She and her husband are buried in the Cedarville Cemetery.

Married **WILLIAM HADLEY**, who died in Cedarville, December, 1869. He was the son of William and Eunice Hadley who are buried in North Winfield. He was a farmer in the town of Litchfield and late in life retired to Cedarville. His grandson, Kernan J. Hadley, is now living on the homestead and remembers that his grandfather was said to have come from England with his parents when quite young, and from North Hadley to Litchfield.

257 **DANIEL BRAINERD⁶ WARNER**, son of Daniel⁵ and Nancy (Brainerd) Warner, born in East Haddam, Conn., March 24, 1807; died there, February 25, 1891. When a young man he went to Clinton, Mich., and for a few years carried on a mercantile business there. Returning to East Haddam he engaged in the business of ship-building, and, in his later years, in the lumber business. Many of the largest ships of his day were constructed in his yard. He resided at East Haddam Landing and took a prominent part in the life of the community. He was a member and for several years vestryman of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church. In 1849 (and again in 1880) he was elected to the State Legislature; in 1852, to the State Senate, and became its President pro tem.; was county commissioner, town clerk and registrar, postmaster, and director and president of the East Haddam Bank. In military circles he was also well known, as a member of the Staff of Gen. Oliver Warner, Brigade Major and Inspector of Artillery. (Commemorative biographical record of Middlesex Co., Conn., p. 436.)

Married in East Haddam, April 28, 1835, **MARY ANNA GREEN**, born in East Haddam, November 11, 1816, died February 23, 1896, daughter of Oliver and Damaris (Howe) Green. Her grandfather, James Green, manufactured muskets for the government during the Revolution.
