Burlington fe. Edward Radolphus Price Gent. one of the Attorneys of the Supreme Court of our Lord the King for the province of New Jersey, present here in Court in his own proper person according to the Liberty & privilege of the same Court for such Attorneys & other Ministers of the same Court from the time whereof the memory of man is not to the contrary used and approved of, complains against Philip Dingley (in custody) for that to wit that whereas the same Philip the day of in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty six at Burlington in the County of Burlington was indebted unto him the said Edward Radolphus Price in the sum of proclamation money, as well for divers sums of money by him & said Edward Rad. Price then and as yet one of the Attorneys as well of the Supreme Court of our Lord the King as of the County Court for holding of pleas in aid for the County of Burlington) as well in and about the prosecution of divers suits in the said County Court, to wit, agt Simon Bozworth and Bellows in a plea of Trespass upon the one other and against Thomas Griffiths in a plea of Trespass upon the case and one other suit against one Edmund Beeke in a plea of Trespass upon the case &c by him the said Edward Radolphus Price for him the same Philip Dingley by that name of his proctor at his request in the County Court then practised as Attorney for him the same Philip Dingley, as also in and about the defence of the said Philip on two Indictments against him the same Philip in the said Supreme Court found & prosecuted to wit the one for a Rape and upon another woman the other for the felonious taking & stealing a hand gun of the goods & chattels of a certain Indian man, by him the said Edw. Rad. Price for him the same Philip at his special instance & request then & there made as Attorney for him the same Philip laid out and disbursed as for the labour & service and Law fees of him the said Edw. Rad. Price in and about the prosecution and defence of the suits aforesaid; and being so thereof indebted to the said Philip in consideration thereof afterwards, to wit, the day of in the year aforesaid at Burlington in the County of Burlington upon himself and to the said Edward Rad. Price then and there did with full promise that he the same Philip Dingley the said sum of money for therein to afterwards he should be required unto him the said Edward Radolphus Price would ~~and~~ faithfully pay & content. And also whereas the said Philip Dingley the day of in the year aforesaid at Burlington in the County of Burlington in consideration that he the said Edward Radolphus Price then one of the Attorneys as well of the said Supreme Court as the said County Court for holding of pleas had prosecuted and defended several suits for the said Philip Dingley as his Attorney (to wit) had prosecuted one at the suit of him the same Philip against one Simon Bozworth and Bellows in a plea of Trespass upon the case one other at the suit of him the said Philip against one Thomas Griffiths, one at the suit of him the same Philip against one Edmund Beeke in a plea of Trespass

the one for a Rape on an Indian woman the other for the felonious taking & stealing
a hand Gun of the goods & Chattels of a certain Indian man against him the same
Philip in the same Supreme Court prosecuted; as found upon him self and to him
the same Edward Rad: Price then & there faithfully promised that he the said
Philip at such sum of money as he the said Ed: Rad: Price for his fees as
Counsel and Attorney for him the said Philip and for his Labour & diligence by
him the said Ed: Rad: Price used and employed in and about the prosecution
and defence of the said severall suits, should reasonably deserve to have unto
him the said Edward Rad: Price when thereunto afterwards he should be required
would well and faithfully pay and content: And the said Edward Rad: Price
in fact hath fulfil'd for his fees as Counsel and Attorney for him the said
Philip in the said severall suits, and for his Labour & diligence in & about prosecu-
tion & defence of the said severall suits reasonably deserve to have of him the said

assurances aforesaid in form aforesaid made, not keeping but contrary
and fraudulently intending him the said Edward Rad: Price in this behalf
craftily & suttily to deceive & defraud the aforesaid severall sums of money in any
part thereof to him the said Edward Rad: Price hath not paid, altho to to
do he the said Philip afterwards, to wit, the said day of

in the year last aforesaid at Burlington aforesaid in the County of Burlington
and of ten afterwards by him the said Edward Rad: Price was thereunto required
but came to him as yet to pay, or him for same in any manner to fulfill
he the said Philip hath sufficient altogether refused and shall do the refuse
to the damage of him the same Ed: Rad: Price pounds proclamation
money and thereof being & trait &c
