more Dollarations filed for the above Penalty Thereupon to take and
have judgement or judgments so of any sume of time after the date
hereof with day of execution until the said first day of June next as
Witness my Hand and seal this Thirteenth Day of May one thousand
and Seven hundred and forty eight

Sealed with the seal of him the said Philip And to the Court of
Our Lord the King Now here stands The date whereof is the same
day of year last aforesaid Did acknowledge him self to owe And
be justly indebted unto the said William in the just sum of thirty
Three pounds Two Shillings & Three pence Money to be paid
to the said William at or upon the first day of June then next
Excluding the date of the same Bill and of the due payment
thereof the said Philip bound him self in the general sum of
Sixty Six pounds four Shillings & Six pence Proclamation Money
as aforesaid And the said William in fact hath that he aforesaid
Philip did not pay unto him the said William the said sum
of Thirty Three pounds Two Shillings & Three pence at or upon the
said first day of June which to him at or upon that same day
he ought to have paid according to the form & usage of the
Bill Obligatory aforesaid Whereby an Action hath accrued unto
him the said William to require & have of him the said Philip
