I Thomas Quigley of the Township of Hamilton County of Mercer and State of New Jersey being of sound disposing mind memory and understanding do make and publish this instrument of writing as and for my last will and testament in manner following that is to say: In the first place I order and direct my Executors hereinafter named to pay and satisfy all my just debts and funeral charges as soon as practicable after my decease.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Moses B. Quigley the several obligations I hold against him for monies advanced and paid for him amounting at this time to the sum of nine hundred dollars, and in addition thereto I give and bequeath to him the sum of fifteen hundred dollars to be paid to him by my Executors in one year after my decease.

Item, I give and bequeath to Emily Joseph and Eliza W. Quigley children of my son Moses B. Quigley the sum of five dollars each to be paid to be paid to them as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one years; by my executors;

Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter Juliana Taylor wife of Job B. Taylor the sum of eighteen hundred dollars to be paid to her by my Executors in one year after my decease or as soon thereafter as practicable and in addition thereto I give and devise to my said daughter Juliana Taylor my house and lot of land situate on New Street

in the City of Trenton New Jersey to her heirs and assigns forever.
I then give and bequeath to my grandson Thomas D Taylor my
silver watch and my double barrel gun

I then give devise and bequeath to my son William C Quigley
the Farm on which he now resides, situate in the townships of
Hamilton aforesaid together with all the stocks farming utensils and
household goods and furniture the same belonging or appertaining during
his natural life and after his decease I give devise and bequeath the
same to his children to be equally divided between them shares and shares
alikes to them their heirs and assigns forever charging my son William
C Quigley with the payment of my funeral expenses the erection to my grave
of a suitable head and feet stone

I then give and bequeath to my son Moses R Quigley and my daugh-
ter Julia Taylor in addition to the bequest left them in the first and third
items of this my will the sum of _____ hundreds dollars each to be paid
to them by my son William C Quigley and with which I charge the paying
the said legacy to my son to be paid in two years and the legacy to my
daughter in three years after my decease

I hereby nominate and appoint my son Moses R Quigley and my son
William C Quigley and my son in law Joel B Taylor Executors of this
my last will and testament

Moses R Dugley Wm C Dugley and Joel B Taylor the Executors in the annexed writing named being the said Moses and the said Joel duly sworn and the said William duly affirmed do depose and say that the said annexed writing contains the true last will and testament of Thomas Dugley the testator therein named deceased, as far as they know and as they verily believe, that they will as the Executors thereof well and truly perform the same first by paying the debts of said deceased and then the legacies therein specified as far as the goods chattels and credits of said deceased do with themunto extend and the law charge them; that they will make and exhibit into the Surrogates office of the County of Mercer a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the said goods chattels and credits as far as the same have or shall come to their possession or knowledge or to the possession of any other persons or persons to their use to their knowledge; and that they will well and truly account where the same lawfully requires. Whereas Thomas Dugley our father died leaving a last Will executed in due form of law by which his property was devised to his children and grand children as he saw fit; and whereas our said father left with his said will a paper in his own hand writing which he termed a codicil to said will in the words and figures following viz

"Codicil to the above will"

November 26, 1863, I give and bequeath to "William C Dugley's daughter Julia Dugley five dollars. I also give to Thomas Taylor my choice bed quilt, and my bureau and trunks and chest & pocket books. I also give to Elyza M Dugley a half dozen silver teaspoons in one year after my decease. And you to Ann Taylor, if any of your money be left at your death it is to go to Thomas Taylor and if you wish any of the bonds to stay about for you, let it be so; and if you wish them all collected in let it be so; and if there be any more to pay two thirds to Moses R Dugley and the other thirds to Julia Ann Taylor. And also my will is to pay Julia Ann Taylor in her legacy the gold and silver in the trunk and the proceeds of the house and lot in Trenton sold for five hundred dollars to be paid to Julia Ann Taylor. And it is my last will that these bequests be justly paid and given to each one by my Executors; and if William C Dugley brings any account against the estate it is not to be allowed" — And whereas the said paper called a codicil was not executed in due form of law there being no witnesses to the signature of the testator and whereas we believe that the said Codicil in connection with the said will expresses the desire and intention of our said father with regards to the disposal

of his property and we desire that the provisions thereof may be
 caused into effect, and his property disposed of as thereby intended
 it should be. Now therefore this agreement made the twelfth
 day of September Eighteen hundred and sixty seven Wittensett that
 we the children and heirs at law of the said testator in consideration of
 the premises above expressed and for the purpose of carrying into effect
 the intention of the testator as expressed in the said Codicil do hereby
 covenant promise and agree with the others that in the settlement of the
 Estate of our said deceased father Thomas Dugley the said Codicil
 shall be carried into effect and all the provisions thereof regarded
 and executed by the executors of his said last will in the same manner
 and to the same extent as would have been had the said Codicil been
 duly executed and proved as part and parcel of the said last will
 and testament of the said Thomas Dugley.
